However, I am happy to report that as I write this (12/3/2020), we are at a new all-time low with an elevation of 901.38. With the extension of our short-term project, I am hopeful that summer of 2021 will bring us the Eagle Lake we all remember.

There were many moving pieces to extending the short-term project. We needed EGLE to extend the permit and we needed all property easement holders to agree to an easement extension. A huge thank you to all of the property owners for extending their easements:

One of the obstacles in extending the permit was one of the property owners did not want to extend his easement because he was selling his lot. We send our heartfelt thanks to Jim Roberts, from Crooked Lake, and Tim Hitson, from Eagle Lake, for purchasing this lot. Without their extremely generous action, we would not have been able to continue pumping.

Our thank you's would not be complete without thanking Texas Township for their support and efforts with our short-term and long-term projects. The behind the scenes effort from them, and especially from township superintendent, Julie VanderWiere, has been outstanding. I have witnessed first hand the time Julie has spent to help make our projects a success. You will be able to find more information on our short-term and long-term pumping projects in the newsletter.

ELTA has made the decision to implement a virtual newsletter, along with a new newsletter format. We think the new style will be easier to read and will allow virtual reading to be a better experience. A virtual newsletter offers many benefits. It can take the printer 2-4 weeks to mail the newsletter so a virtual newsletter will allow us to disseminate information in real time. Short Term Pumping Update

*EGLE granted an extension through June 30, 2021. One of the concerns from Bentwood and Crooked Lake was another summer of pumping. A permit ending in June was part of our negotiation process.

*As mentioned in the President's Letter, all easement property owners agreed to extending their easements to allow pumping through the winter and spring. Our negotiations focused on pumping as long as possible, especially to give us relief in May. Here are the May rainfall amounts from the past 4 years:

2020 - 6.10"

2019 - 6.95"

2018 - 8.00"

2017 - 3.39"

*the historical average is 3". The 4 year average is 6.11".

The record breaking rain has been the number one factor in the downfalls of this project. Let's hope Mother Nature grants us a dry 2021.

*ELTA will continue to monitor the township asking for rate increase requests from EGLE. We are currently pumping at 1200 gym (720 gpm out of Eagle). EGLE cut back our pump rates in 2019 and gradually increased rates until we were back at our maximum capacity of 2000 gpm. EGLE denied our rate increase in early Nov. due to warm weather so we are running about 3 weeks behind 2019 pump rates. We are working on a document that will show 2019 dates and pump rates to help encourage EGLE to grant pump rate increases sooner rather than later.

*Currently, the township strives to keep the drawdown rates at an equal level for both lakes. When Crooked reaches their permit elevation, the hope/plan is we will be able to pump Eagle at max c rooked Lake doesn't rise

<u>Year-End Review With Restorative Lake Science (RLS)</u>: At the year-end review with RLS, Jennifer advised that our lake was doing very well considering the severe flooding of several years. The 2020 RLS annual lake report is on our website for your review. In a separate section of this newsletter, Jennifer provides the highlights of the RLS report.

<u>Aeration</u>: Our aeration system remains "on the shelf" at PLM. We hope to reinstall in 2021.

<u>Weed Treatment</u>: Eagle Lake experienced its usual abundance of good and bad weeds in 2020. We expect similar conditions in 2021 and we will provide treatment accordingly.

<u>Bio-Augmentation</u>: We anticipate doing a full bio-augmentation program in 2021. The treatment areas to be treated by PLM (our applicator) will be based on the most recent bottom hardness scan completed by RLS. As a reminder, the Airmax Muck-away pellets we utilize have bacteria which when released help digest the muck that accumulates at the lake bottom. We anticipate at least one more treatment in 2020.

<u>Goose Abatement Program</u>: Unfortunately, in 2020, Governor Whitmer issued an executive order cancelling all scheduled round-ups due to COVID-19 restrictions and state budgetary concerns. We expect to resume our goose abatement program in 2021. Hopefully, this will put us back on track for future spring nest-destructions as a means to help reduce the population of geese on the lake.

Status Update—December 2020

Since our short term pumping for Eagle Lake will stop on or about 1 June 2021, it is critical that we move ahead with implementation of the long term solution. Now is the time for the flooding situation in Texas Township to be permanently remedied.

As a reminder, the long term solution mirrors the short term solution in many respects. Both solutions remove water from Crooked and Eagle Lakes and route it into Bass Lake, which then drains into Portage Creek. The major differences between the short term pumping and the long term solution are these: the long term solution will use underground piping; it will be gravity fed; it will use natural ground filtration versus pump filtration, the easements and piping routes will be new; and most importantly, it will be a permanent structure.

As of December 2020, we are still waiting for several critical actions that must happen for implementation of our long term solution for the flooding in Texas Township.

These actions are:

- 1. The Prein&Newhof engineering study on recommended Legal Lake Levels (LLLs) for Crooked and Eagle Lakes needs to be released by the Kalamazoo Drain Office.
- 2. The LLL petitions for Eagle and Crooked Lakes need to be submitted to the designated Michigan Court for a decision. Note the Court's decision will provide guidance for assigning boundaries and costs for the SAD (special assessment district)
- 3. The Michigan Environmental Great Lakes and Energy Department (EGLE) needs to issue a permit for the long term solution.
- 4. Texas Township needs to begin the engineering process so that Prein&Newhof can complete final planning for the long term solution.

The pending actions cited above are significant. Although we are close to finalizing the long term solution, it is absolutely essential that we stay resolute in our focus to complete these actions so that the long term solution can happen.

It has been a long hard journey to get where we are ... and we still have a way to go. Please stay engaged, and hopefully we will soon be successful in implementing our long term solution.

RLS Lake Quality Report

The overall condition of Eagle Lake is ranked in the top 25% of developed lakes of similar size in the state of Michigan. In 2020, the water clarity was between 6.5-9.0 feet which was slightly lower than in recent years, presumably due to increased nutrients and associated algal growth. Eagle Lake experienced some depletion of dissolved oxygen with depth during 2020 and this may have been due to warmer water temperatures which hold less oxygen.

Additionally, the lake nutrients (phosphorus and nitrogen) have increased in 2020 and thus support abundant submersed aquatic plant growth which required two large-scale treatments on June 9 and June 18, 2020. Abundant milfoil was noted late in the 2020 season and may require aggressive treatment in the spring of 2021.



The overall hardness of the Lake bottom is improving despite the aeration pumps being disabled, as shown on the left

Milfoil treatment this summer was largely successful, although there was a fall surge because of our warmer temperatures. The graphic on the right shows the Milfoil hot spots.






